

FROM THE DIRECTOR... (CONTINUED)


Today I present to you what I believe is at the heart of what we do. It is a word that is essential to every aspect of living not only in preaching, but in marriage, friendship, relationships and in everyday living.

The word is COMMUNICATION. We thrive on this and the better that we are in this the more effect we will have on the lives of others. The reason marriages fail is because the communication is not there and without communication, love is extremely difficult to share. Friendships without good communication don't last very long. Relationships begin to die and people look to move on.

Our culture doesn't really help with this because we move at such a rapid pace, we don't leave time to communicate and it takes a commitment of time to be good at communicating.

The reason there are good communicators is because they are convinced when they communicate it is always about the other; make them laugh, compliment them, tell them you love them. It is not about themselves.

Interesting phenomenon about texting... People text to get a response... And will continue texting until they get a response. The focus becomes the response and the

beauty of communication is not to seek a response but to make the other person happy. And I know that this will always lead to better relationships, stronger friendships and truly lasting marriages. People kid me by saying, "what do you know about Marriage?" The two most important qualities in marriage are love and communication and I KNOW a great deal about both of those.

I recently heard from someone..."I'm not very good at communicating". And many say that as if they can't get better. Communication is an art and a skill... But most of all it is a COMMITMENT. Good preachers make this Commitment to the congregation.

The word Homily comes from the Greek word, homileo, which means a conversation and comes from the Scripture Passage when Jesus was walking to Emmaus with two of his disciples. They were conversing as they walked and communicated their love, interest and faith. Good preachers have a conversation with their audience even though the audience doesn't verbally speak but they respond and the preacher connects.

So my prayer and hope for all of us is that we get as good as we can in communicating. It has profound results even when we don't know what the other will respond. It is a commitment and it always takes time, but "time well spent" as the phrase goes. Pray for all the marriages that struggle with this. I pray for all the friendships that thrive because of this and I continue to pledge to you that we on the Vincentian Parish Mission Team will work as hard as we can to communicate to you God's love for us and our love for you. As the great Robert Schuller says to conclude all his sermons, "God loves you and so do I."


