


As we are entering the season of Lent, I expect most of us are expecting to hear that often asked question; "What are you giving up or sacrificing for Lent?"





CONGREGATION ON THE MISSION

The Vincentian Parish Mission Center and all of its priests are members of the Congregation of the Mission (C.M.).

The Congregation of The Mission was founded by St. Vincent DePaul in France in 1625, as an organization of men (priests and brother) formed for the purpose of providing for worship of God, through following the example of Jesus in caring for and ministering to the poor. As this Congregation was formed by St. Vincent, and they continue the mission to extend Vincent's dream they are called "Vincentian," and with the many other Vincentian Organizations they make up the Vincentian Family.

Vincent realized rural and poor communities were underserved and felt the need and calling to provide support, care and education in a variety of ways to these people. Much of this effort was by means of Parish Missions to educate, care for and evangelize the people of these underserved areas.

It was a goal of Vincent's to eventually serve God's people in the rural and poor communities throughout the whole world. Today there are over 3,000 Vincentian priests and brothers serving in 86 countries around the world.
