






Our trip to Assisi, Italy where Fr. Bob and I were able to say Mass in the special chapel of St. Francis that proved to be meaningful and very moving.

Very Reverend Gregory Gay, C.M. is the Superior General of the Congregation of the Mission, making him the successor of St. Vincent DePaul as the leader of the Vincentian Family.



Fr. Gregory has called for a Year of Collaboration for all of the Vincentian Family that began on May 24, 2015 (Pentecost) and will end on May 15, 2016 (Pentecost).

During this Year of Collaboration Fr. Gregory has called all Vincentians to come together in their communities to learn more about the various Vincentian Organizations and how they may work together to improve and expand the way they serve the needs of the poor.

The Vincentian Family comprises organizations formed by St Vincent or inspired by the life and work of St. Vincent DePaul and is made up of many organizations working to continue the charism (a divinely conferred extraordinary power given a Christian by the Holy Spirit for the good of the church) of St. Vincent to educate, care and serve the poor around the world.

"VINCENTIAN WOMEN CHANGING COMMUNITIES WITH JOY AND HOPE"

You can expect to be inspired by Sr. Helen Prejean, who is known around the world as a tireless advocate of compassion and care for prisoners, victims of crime, and for the elimination of the death penalty. Sr. Prejean began her prison ministry in 1981 when she dedicated her life to the poor of New Orleans. She is the author of the book "Dead Man Walking", which later became a major motion picture.

In addition, you will be enriched and enlightened by Sr. Frances Ryan as she presents "An Historical View of the Spirituality of the Women who Answered St. Vincent's Call." Sr. Fran will give a brief overview of the talent and commitment of the first Ladies of Charity in France and in America, emphasizing their spirituality, roles in service of people living in poverty, and relevance to our mission today.
